



The Dust Commander Lifetime Achievement Award - Dust Commander was a small, unassuming chestnut Thoroughbred born in Illinois. Though no one thought he could win, and despite getting bumped by another horse coming out of the starting gate, he won the 96th running of the Kentucky Derby in 1970.

This award celebrates his achievements and seeks to honor a horse who shares Dust Commander's spirit of excellence. This annual award honors an equine recognizing their special valor or outstanding competitive achievement.

The Paul Briney Ambassador Award is presented to an organization or individual who demonstrates excellence and outstanding service to the equestrian community by putting on events and/or providing education for the non-equestrian community to introduce them to horses; helping to open new horse trails or provide new public horse-related amenities; working diligently to improve or maintain existing horse related-amenities; obtaining favorable publicity to promote an Illinois equestrian lifestyle; or, use of horses in a way that engages and benefits the public.




